Treatments Available

- Infusion medications
- Prolia/Reclast (strengthen bones, prevent osteoporosis)
- Feraheme and Venofer (iron infusions)
- Remicade/Entyvio (for ulcerative colitis and Crohn's)
- Blood Transfusions
- Hydration
- IV antibiotics infusion series
- Aranesp/Neupogen (increase body's own production of red or white blood cells)
- Immune Globulin or IVIG
- Injections
- Port flushes
- PICC dressing changes
- Lab draws through ports and PICCS
- Catheter changes
- Dressing changes
- · Wound vac dressing changes
- Suture/staple removal
